

MOLSON GRAND PRIX OF TO-RONTO—JULY 7, 8 AND 9 ("DON'T CALL IT THE "INDY"...")

Race 7 in the Champ Car World Series was won by A J Allmendinger, his third in a row. Second was Forsythe teammate Paul Tracy; third was Sebastian Bourdais.

Side note: A J Allmendinger; Yogi Berra; Dick Butkus; Itzak Perlman; Northern Dancer – what do they all have in common? See end of story..... Since I'm not especially knowledgeable about Champ Car (or F1, for that matter), I can't describe in much detail what went on on track. Instead I'll talk about impressions, moments, and trivia – and contrasts with the Grand Prix du Montreal a couple weeks earlier...

Registration:. ...for F1, at a trailer somewhere on lle St Helene (couldnta found it without Andre ⑤) ... Champ Car – at a downtown hotel. Advantage: Toronto

Morning Meetings: at Montreal, 6:00; 6:15, and 7:00 (Fri, Sat, Sun), with lots of juice, fruit, muffins, coffee, etc.. In Toronto – at 6:45 every day; coffee and muffins. Advantage: Montreal

Shuttles from/to Parking and Corners: - at Montreal, school buses....at Toronto, lots of passenger vans, with A/C and music; they even helped us load and unload our stuff

Advantage: Toronto Corner Assignments: Rotated at Montreal; same corner all three days at Champ Car. Advantage:

Montreal

We were at Corner 8, which is a 90-degree right-hander with a straight-ahead run off; a good corner to get a good up-close view of the cars. There were five on my crew – not enough to man the Safety positions, but with Champ Car they don't want you out on the track responding to stuff anyway ©. As it happened, the mirror-flagging station across track was in front of a pass-control

crew who had brought along a portable barbecue for the weekend, which they offered to let us use. So Sunday we had a nice hot lunch, in addition to the lunches supplied (which were good).

It was interesting that, at our station (and presumably at others), there were land line connections at both the main and mirror stations, and at the blue flagger's post.

There were two temporary grandstands set up on scaffolds under the Gardiner Expressway, just down track from our station. On Sunday afternoon, everyone on one of the platforms was sitting with their backs to the track – not watching the racing but watching the World Cup final on someone's TV or laptop ©.

My Corner Captain was a fellow from Maryland; nice guy. His wife got to ride in one of the vehicles carrying the drivers for the drivers' parade. I'm told Don Cherry and Wayne Gretsky were also in the parade vehicles, but I didn't see them (at that point we were probably barbecuing lunch ③). Our crew also included a guy from England, whom I'd met at the F1 race; and two MMS marshals. Good group....

Apres-Race: ...at Toronto, lots of hot food and cold drinks... at Montreal, lots of hot food and BEER!! Advantage: Montreal bien sur ☺

Quality of Experience: Both terrific; will do'em again. Advantage: tie

We were treated extremely well at Toronto; continually supplied with water and ice; driven here and there whenever we needed; and just generally looked after thoughtfully by BARC. Even for a sort of non-Champ Car fan, it was a great experience. We had a good time; met lots of neat people; and, as always learned something. (This was my first experience checking the welds on man-hole covers and drains on the race track...@). I'll be there next year, and I'd recommend it to anyone else who's interested.

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A BRIEF HISTORY

The Canadian Race Communications Association (CRCA) is Canada's first and most experienced race marshalling club. It has played a significant role in the Ontario racing commu-



nity since 1959, joining the Canadian Automobile Sport Clubs (CASC) in 1960, and acquiring its Federal Charter in 1962. Based at Shannonville Motorsport Park, the Club supports the racing environment by providing Corner Marshals for all forms of racing events including regional open and closed-wheel cars, R.A.C.E. Series motorcycles, go-karts and numerous special interest groups.

CRCA Marshals have participated at racing events at Mosport Park from opening day to the present. Our members worked at events at Green Acres (near Goderich, ON) and Harewood Acres (south of Hamilton, ON) until their closing.

Our club organized the Corner Marshals for the first ever Canadian Grand Prix at Mosport International Raceway (formerly Mosport Park) in 1967, and also in 1967, were responsible for providing Marshals for the Motorcycle Grand Prix of Canada, notably the only time this country has had an FIM-sanctioned Grand Prix! CRCA has been involved in the Toronto Molson Indy from its inaugural event, and continues to participate each year.
